Holy Week Tapestries by Armando Sosa

Today in the chancel hangs the first tapestry of a Holy Week triptych by Armando Sosa, a master weaver and our artist-in-residence. Our Sanctuary will be graced by two more tapestries on Maundy Thursday and Easter.

Of the Palm Sunday tapestry, the Worship and Arts Committee writes, with reference to a publication on Christian symbols by the PC(USA), “The people of Jerusalem greeted Jesus with palm branches cut from local trees, to use as a sign of victory befitting a triumphant king. This king, however, rode in on a humble donkey to bring peace, not might, knowing that those who today shout ‘Hosanna! Save us!’ will soon turn to crucify him. In this weaving, palm trees, full of historic significance in Hebrew scripture, frame the picture of ironic victory, while the three crosses upon the hillock in the distance foretell what is to come: tragedy and apparent defeat, but ultimately, Christ’s victory over death.”

- We mark Holy Tuesday, April 11, with a *Nassau at the Windrows* service at 3:00 PM in the Wilson Gallery.
- We observe *Maundy Thursday* with a noon Communion service in Niles Chapel, followed by lunch. Bus service runs to Stonebridge and the Windrows. In the evening join us at 7:30 PM for a Communion and tenebrae service in the Sanctuary.
- On *Good Friday*, we worship at 12:00 PM in the Sanctuary. Childcare available.
- On *Easter Sunday* we gather for a sunrise service at 7:00 AM in Niles Chapel and we continue to celebrate Easter with services at 9:00 and 11:00 AM.

Breaking Bread will celebrate a service at 5:00 PM in Niles Chapel, followed by an Easter feast in the Assembly Room.

On Easter there will be no Adult Education, Church School, or Worship Explorers. There is childcare for infants and toddlers during the 9:00 and 11:00 AM services and a Bible story and activity time for children age three to grade one.
