Childcare is available for infants and toddlers in the Nursery (Lower Level), 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM.

9:15 Children may leave for Church School classes. Teachers and ushers can assist in finding classrooms.  
11:00 Children pre-kindergarten or age four to grade three may leave for Worship Explorers in Room 302.

Worship Explorers is a child-focused alternative worship setting during 11:00 AM worship for children age 4 to grade 3. Children attend the first part of the service and are then dismissed to Room 302 (Third Floor).
