She is a parish associate at The New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C., where her husband, Roger J. Gench, is the pastor.

that present serious interpretive challenges for contemporary Christian faith and practice. Should they be repudiated? Discarded? Silenced? Or are there perhaps more effective and faithful ways of handling them? Come and tackle the importance of engaging them directly and publicly, with the expectation that we may encounter the living God in our conversation with them. Passages in Paul's letters that have proved oppressive in the lives of many Christian women will serve as test cases. Join us as we wrestle with them, consider strategies for engaging them with integrity, and reflect on our understandings of biblical authority.

Let's get started by reflecting together on our relationship with the Bible and with passages that confound us!

SAT FEB 11

9:15 am Session 2 BEYOND TEXTUAL HARRASMENT: ENGAGING TYRANNICAL TEXTS

Consider strategies for engaging tyrannical texts with integrity and reflect on how the Bible exercises authority in our lives. Work with 1 Tim 2:8-15 (the pivotal biblical passage in church controversies over the role of women in church and society) and Ephesians 5:21-33 (a passage promoting "wifely subordination," the most fully developed argument in the New Testament for gender hierarchy).

3:30 pm Session 3 WORSHIP WARS

Wrestle with 1 Corinthians 11:2-16, the only assertion of gender hierarchy in Paul's authentic letters. This obscure passage responds to conflict in the Corinthian church over appropriate headwear or hairstyles in worship, provoked by women exercising leadership in worship.

7:30 pm Session 4 WOMEN & WORSHIP WARS

Examine 1 Corinthians 14:33-36, a text in which women are commanded to be "silent" in worship assemblies. For most of Christian history it has been used to deny women participation and leadership in the Christian community.

SUN FEB 12 9:30 am Session 5 WOMEN IN MINISTRY

We will conclude with Romans 16, an often-overlooked passage that is a precious resource for recovering the lives of real women in the early Pauline churches.
