Note on offertory anthem text

"Jesus Christ the Apple Tree" is a mystical folk hymn from the 18th century based on Songs of Solomon 2:3 and Revelation 22:1–2. Culturally, it is a Christian appropriation of the pagan tradition of wassailing the apple orchards in early January, literally toasting to their good health for next year's harvest. This practice occurred close to the time that the twelfth night after Christmas is celebrated and wassailing with apple cider on 12th Night is still observed in some parts of England. While some sources attribute the text to a Rev. Richard Hutchins (1698-1781), its authorship remains in doubt.

32 I Sing the Mighty Power of God



With minimal revision this text brings together six of the eight four-line stanzas in an 18th-century hymn written for children and originally headed "Praise for Creation and Providence." The anonymous German tune provides a fitting sense of breadth and wonder.

Today We All Are Called to Be Disciples



This text placing stewardship in the context of faithful witness was written by a retired Presbyterian minister to be part of the 1986 stewardship campaign titled "Called to Be Disciples." The tune name recalls the Sussex village where the arranger first heard the melody.


