He studied History at Northwestern University and then went to Trinity Seminary and is an ordained minister of the Presbyterian Church (USA). He leads a church in Nutley and serves on several committees for our denomination both regionally and nationally. He is the Stated Clerk of the Eastern Korean American Presbytery and works as a Senior Living Advisor. Joe is an avid fisherman and a Program Leader for the Appalachian Mountain Club. He lives in Paramus with his wife and two teenage children.

Welcome to Nassau Church

Children are always welcome in our services of worship.

Childcare is available for infants and toddlers in the Nursery (Lower Level), 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM.

Church School takes place during the 9:15 AM service. Classes for grades 6 to 12 begin at 9:15 AM. Preschoolers to grade 5 participate in the first part of the service and are then dismissed to their classes. All classes conclude at 10:30 AM.

Worship Explorers is a child-focused alternative worship setting during 11:00 AM worship for children age 3 to grade 3. Children attend the first part of the service and are then dismissed to Room 302 (Third Floor).
