

About Thula Sizwe (Today's Guest Choir)

Thula Sizwe was born from a love of music, a pride in culture, and a need for expression. Formed in 1984, the founding members were all in high school and conditions were very difficult for Black South Africans. Amid the oppressive policies of Apartheid against any gathering, the students appealed to their school principal, and together they convinced the police and military to allow them to sing for no more than 30 minutes after school each day. The group became wellknown in their township, and in 1988, Jabulani Abel Dlamini heard the young men singing. Abel — who is a descendant of generations of Zulu musicians — saw the tremendous potential in the young men and offered to teach the group what he had learned from his ancestors, effectively becoming the group's leader. When Apartheid ended in 1994, Thula Sizwe was called upon by the government to be cultural ambassadors for the "new" South Africa — the "Rainbow Nation," as Desmund Tutu called it. The group has traveled to many countries around the world sharing Zulu culture and promoting goodwill and peace. While performers have come and gone over the years, several of the founding members continue to sing with the group today, and Abel still serves as the group's leader.

Welcome to Nassau Church

Children are always welcome in our services of worship.

Childcare is available for infants and toddlers in the Nursery (Lower Level), 9:00 AM to 12:30 PM.

Church School takes place during the 9:15 AM service. Classes for grades 6 to 12 begin at 9:15 AM. Preschoolers to grade 5 participate in the first part of the service and are then dismissed to their classes. All classes conclude at 10:30 AM.

Worship Explorers is a child-focused alternative worship setting during 11:00 AM worship for children age 3 to grade 3. Children attend the first part of the service and are then dismissed to Room 302 (Third Floor).
